

WAR TAKES TOLL FROM SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA LIST

A new flag was added last night to the decorations of the Orchestra hall stage. It was crimson and white, with two blue stars, indicating the first toll taken by the war from the roster of the Chicago Symphony orchestra.

The stars are for William Guetter of the bassoons and William Hoss of the French horn section. Both men are now in service at Great Lakes. Two other members of the orchestra, A. Ulrich and H. Felber, are now represented in America's fighting forces by their respective sons.

Last night's was the final orchestra concert of the season, and the audience, on its feet for "The Star Spangled Banner," remained at attention till Mr. Stock had been recalled and given a fanfare by the players.

Detroit, Mich., April 20.—[Special.]—It became known today that John Dodge Jr., son of John Dodge, motor car manufacturer, was secretly married three weeks ago at Pontiac to Miss Marie Anna O'Connor, daughter of M. B. O'Connor, a wealthy Detroit contractor.

Allies Beat Off Enemy in Macedonia Attack

PARIS, April 20.—Tonight's official statement on military operations in Macedonia says:

"There was artillery activity west of Lake Doiran, in the neighborhood of Dobropolje, and west of Monastir. At the Cerna bend several enemy detachments attacked the Italian lines south of Vlakar, but were obliged to withdraw after a spirited combat, abandoning material. An attempt by the enemy at a surprise attack against our positions between the lakes was repulsed."
